

Public safety employee

If public safety employee becomes symptomatic, public safety employee will need to remain isolated for 7 days from when the symptoms start OR 3 days after symptoms stop, whichever is longer. ALL CDC and State Health requirements to regulate this guideline.

Non-public safety employee

If non-public safety employee has come into contact with someone exposed and becomes symptomatic, non-public safety employee will need to remain isolated for 7 days from when the symptoms start OR 3 days after symptoms stop, whichever is longer. If non-public safety employee does not develop symptoms non-public safety employee will be cleared after 14 days.

Non-public safety employee

If non-public safety employee has come into contact with a confirmed positive case, non-public safety employee needs to self-quarantine for 14 days.

If, within those 14 days, non-public safety employee becomes symptomatic, non-public safety employee will need to remain isolated for 7 days from when the symptoms start OR 3 days after symptoms stop, whichever is longer.

If non-public safety employee does not develop symptoms non-public safety employee will be cleared after 14 days.
